Clean Water Act, Section 401 Certification of Nationwide Permits

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) has proposed to issue nationwide permits (NWPs) applicable within Minnesota and Wisconsin, including within the exterior boundaries of Indian Reservations.

In accordance with Section 401 of the Clean Water Act (CWA), the Bad River Band of Lake Superior Tribe of Chippewa Indians is examining the application of the NWPs and is evaluating if there is reasonable assurance—with conditions attached —that the activities associated with these general permits will be consistent with relevant water quality considerations.

The Tribe seeks comments on its CWA Section 401 Certification decision associated with the issuance of Nationwide Permits. All comments are considered during the project review.
