

# ELECTION DAY IS TUESDAY APRIL 4



**On April 4, the power is in the hands of the people – vote to choose who will be the next judge on the Supreme Court.** The Supreme Court will likely take cases in the near future that have to do with voting, the Enbridge Line 5 Pipeline, abortion, climate regulations, and more. The decisions the judges make will impact our children and their children for generations.

## **YOU CAN VOTE IF YOU ARE:**

- a U.S. citizen
- at least 18 years old
- a WI resident who has resided at your current address for at least 28 consecutive days before Election Day
- “off papers” from a felony conviction (if convicted of a felony, you have completed terms of sentence, including probation and parole)

## **VOTE ON OR BEFORE ELECTION DAY**

- Register and vote in-person on Election Day.
- Request an absentee ballot by mail or vote early in-person.
- Make sure to bring a photo ID to vote. If you need to register, bring a proof of residency.
- **To find your polling place, go to [myvote.wi.gov](https://myvote.wi.gov).** Polling locations are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
