## Clean Water Act, Section 401 Certification of 2026 Pesticide General Permit

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has proposed to issue 2026 Pesticide General Permit (PGP) applicable within Minnesota and Wisconsin, including within the exterior boundaries of Indian Reservations.

In accordance with Section 401 of the Clean Water Act (CWA), the Bad River Band of Lake Superior Tribe of Chippewa Indians is examining the application of the PGP and is evaluating if there is reasonable assurance—with conditions attached —that the activities associated with this general permit will be consistent with relevant water quality considerations.

The Tribe seeks comments on its CWA Section 401 Certification decision associated with the issuance of Pesticide General Permit. All comments are considered during the project review. ## **Background**

The Bad River Band of Lake Superior Tribe of Chippewa Indians holds 401 certification authority over federal permits authorized by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The 401 Certification by the Bad River Band ensures that the activities authorized by such permits are consistent with the Bad River Band Water Quality Standards and other relevant water quality considerations.
